LE MOYNE COLLEGE MISSION STATEMENT

Le Moyne College is a diverse learning community that strives for academic excellence in the Catholic and Jesuit tradition through its comprehensive programs rooted in the liberal arts and sciences. Its emphasis is on education of the whole person and on the search for meaning and value as integral parts of the intellectual life. Le Moyne College seeks to prepare its members for leadership and service in their personal and professional lives to promote a more just society.

Academic Regalia

The origin of academic caps, gowns and hoods dates to the 12th century and the rise of the universities, which were originally under the auspices of the church, and whose faculties were comprised of churchmen. These scholars were clerical robes, hoods and capes as much for warmth during the long, cold European winters as for distinction.

Today the standard academic regalia worn in the United States are of three types. The bachelor's gown is characterized by its simplicity of line and long, pointed sleeves, distinguishing it from the master's gown, best recognized by its rectangular, "wing-like" sleeves. The doctor's gown, with full, bell-shaped sleeves, is faced in front and back with velvet and has three velvet bars across the sleeves. In addition, the tassel on the doctor's cap may be gold.

The hood is the most symbolic part of the academic regalia. Its size and shape indicate the level of the degree held, its lining shows the colors of the institution granting it, and the color of its velvet border corresponds to the general academic program of the degree. Thus, all Le Moyne hoods are lined with green and gold, the College colors. Among the hoods worn by Le Moyne graduates and faculty, most have borders of one of the following colors: white (arts and letters) for those with the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Master of Arts; golden yellow (science), corresponding to the degree of Bachelor of Science or Master of Science; and dark blue (philosophy), worn by faculty holding the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in various academic disciplines. Other colors worn by Le Moyne faculty and administrative personnel, indicating the master's or doctor's degree they hold, include crimson (theology), purple (law), drab (business administration) and light blue (education).

All student regalia is made in the USA from 100 percent post-consumer plastic bottles.

Stoles, cords and pins signify academic honors, membership in an academic honor society, or significant engagement in co-curricular activities, exemplifying Le Moyne's mission to educate the hearts and minds of students in inspiring them to become persons for others.

JONATHAN CAPEHART

Jonathan Capehart was just 10 years old when he realized that he wanted to become a journalist. A New Jersey native, he was fascinated by the idea that he could make a career of sharing other people's stories, capturing not just moments in time, but also invaluable lessons about life and humanity. There was no road map for Jonathan to follow on this adventure, so he created his own. Along the way he was inspired by industry giants like Bryant Gumbel and buoyed by family members who cheered him on as he "dreamed out loud." By almost any measure, those dreams have come true. Today this Pulitzer Prize-winner, a self-described "news nerd," is helping to shape the landscape of print, digital and television journalism.

A graduate of Carleton College, Jonathan is the associate editor of *The Washington Post*, where he serves as an opinion writer and member of the newspaper's editorial board, and hosts a weekly podcast, *Capehart*, and a weekly Washington Post Live show, *First Look*. His impact on the field of news does not end at the newspaper's doors, though. Jonathan works as an analyst on *The PBS Newshour* and is featured on the program's popular segment *Brooks and Capehart*. He also hosts a current affairs program, *The Sunday Show with Jonathan Capehart*, on MSNBC. Earlier in his career, while working at the *New York Daily News* as the deputy editorial page editor and a member of the paper's editorial board, Jonathan was part of a team that engaged in a 16-month editorial campaign to save the famed Apollo Theater in Harlem. That project earned him and the board the Pulitzer Prize for Editorial Writing.

To each of these endeavors, Jonathan brings a thoughtful perspective that is urgently needed during a fractured moment in American political life. He is an exceedingly skilled interviewer and attentive listener, but what Jonathan's readers and viewers may appreciate most about him is the care and respect with which he treats his interlocutors, from prominent elected officials to his beloved Aunt Gloria, who has appeared on TV alongside her nephew.

Even with this busy schedule, Jonathan seems to have endless energy. His MSNBC special A *Promised Land:* A *Conversation with Barack Obama* was nominated in 2021 for an Emmy for Outstanding News Discussion and Analysis. He has also moderated panels at the Aspen Ideas Festival and for the Aspen Institute, the Center for American Progress and the Brussels Forum of the German Marshall Fund. In 2019, he served as a fellow at the Georgetown Institute of Politics and Public Service.

In addition to his work, Jonathan is a devoted spouse. He has called his husband, Nick, his "fiercest champion." Jonathan has been recognized for his efforts to support members of the African-American and LGBT communities in the areas of entertainment, media, civil rights, business and art. In June 2020, the publication *Queerty* named him among the 50 heroes "leading the nation toward equality, acceptance and dignity for all people."

Dan Cummings

Dan Cummings might be the most trusted man in Central New York. That's no small claim, but if anyone has earned this title, it's Dan. For more than 30 years, this journalist's smooth delivery and calm, empathetic demeanor have given listeners and viewers the feeling that he's not just delivering the news, he's speaking directly to them.

A native of King Ferry, N.Y., in Cayuga County, Dan graduated in 1977 from SUNY Geneseo, where he first got his feet wet on the college's AM and FM radio stations, serving as a disc jockey, news director and station manager. After working at 680 WNYR, a country radio station in Rochester, he moved on to WTKO in Ithaca before landing at WHEN in Syracuse, a position to which he was recruited by legendary local news reporter Bill Carey. In 1984 Dan began his 37-year career at News Channel 9 as assignment editor. He was promoted to assistant news director in 1987 and news director in 1989.

Soon after, he made his on-air television debut, the beginning of a 30-plus year career reporting and anchoring on WSYR-TV. In 2008 he began a 13-year run anchoring the station's morning news. He also hosted "Newsmakers with Dan Cummings," Channel 9's weekly public affairs program. His retirement from WSYR in December 2021 was marked by colleagues and many others in the community, including the Onondaga County Legislature and fellow honorary degree recipient Rep. John Katko (NY-24), who, in a resolution on the floor of the U.S. House of Representatives, called Dan "one of the most fair and genuine news professionals and an extremely generous man."

Dan's professionalism and attention to detail did not go unnoticed. He has been recognized numerous times by his peers, including twice being honored with the Syracuse Press Club's "Professional Standards" award. In 2013, he was honored with a regional Edward R. Murrow award for best news documentary for "Saints Among Us," which told the stories of newly canonized saints Marianne Cope and Kateri Tekakwitha, women with deep roots in Central and upstate New York. In 2018 he received the Press Club's highest honor when he was named to the Wall of Distinction and last year Dan was honored with an Emmy award for "Veterans Voices," a program dedicated to honoring the service and sacrifice of local veterans. He holds a Master's Degree in Communication Arts from Cornell and has served as an adjunct professor at Onondaga Community College, teaching a class called "Public Information Officer Basic Course."

Over the years, Dan has consistently lent his time and talent to others. He has served as an emcee at fundraising events for various organizations and as a member of the board of trustees of Bishop Grimes Junior-Senior High School. In 2018, Dan was honored by Catholic Charities of Onondaga County at the 33rd annual House of Providence Dinner with the Bishop's Award, which recognized his personal and professional commitment to serving the community.

A man of deep Catholic faith, Dan is married to Danielle, the chancellor and director of communications for the Diocese of Syracuse. They are the proud parents of Anna and Jonah, a member of Le Moyne's Class of 2021.

INDU GUPTA, M.D.

Author and philosopher Ralph Waldo Emerson believed that "the first wealth is health." Indu Gupta knows this to be true. As commissioner of the Onondaga County Health Department (OCHD), Indu oversees a team of professionals dedicated to ensuring that the county's approximately 473,000 residents have a safe environment in which to live, work and play. The department's responsibilities include collecting and analyzing health data, tracking disease, and addressing public health emergencies, all of which have been of paramount importance over the past two years. Indu has led the county's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In the earliest days of the historic public health crisis, she led strong efforts to protect the health of community residents by implementing strategies to test, track, isolate and quarantine to control transmission of the virus in Onondaga County. Once COVID-19 vaccines received emergency use authorization, she led a very successful COVID-19 mass vaccination campaign by the OCHD that began in December 2020 and worked collaboratively with community leaders of faith-based organizations, educational institutions, hospitals and local medical providers to ensure there were no barriers to vaccination in the county. Through it all, Indu has modeled what it means to treat others with empathy, compassion and respect.

None of this comes as a surprise to the people closest to this caregiver. They know her as an outstanding practitioner who draws meaning and purpose from her work. Indu earned a medical degree in India, a master of arts in public administration and a certificate of advanced study in health service management and policy from the Maxwell School at Syracuse University, and a master of public health from Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. Her initial work in private practice spurred her interest in population health with a special focus on epidemiology and quality and process improvement. Prior to her current role, she was a clinical assistant professor at the University of California at Los Angeles. She was named to her current role at the OCHD in 2014. Since then she has focused her energies on community health assessment and improvement plans, and she successfully achieved the first national accreditation for OCHD from the Public Health Accreditation Board in 2018.

In conjunction with her work at the health department, Indu serves as the co-chair of the Onondaga County Drug Task Force and is a member of Early Childhood Alliance. She has served as a member of Greater Syracuse H.O.P.E., a local anti-poverty coalition where she advocated for health equity and "Health in All Policy" because economic disparities negatively impact health outcomes. She is the current president of the New York State Association of County Health Officials. A highly respected practitioner, she is board certified in internal medicine and is a fellow of the American College of Physicians. In everything she does, Indu models the maxim: "The good physician treats the disease; the great physician treats the patient who has the disease."

JOHN KATKO, J.D.

John Katko begins each day by asking himself one question: How can I best be of service?

For nearly eight years, John has advocated on behalf of the residents of New York's 24th Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives, where he is the ranking member on the Committee on Homeland Security and a member of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure. John has used his time in office to advance a wide range of issues, including business, infrastructure and, of course, education. He has been a staunch advocate for Le Moyne College, helping to secure federal funds to support a number of the College's critical initiatives. A member of the bipartisan Problem Solvers Caucus, John has earned a reputation for working across the political aisle in order to solve some of the nation's most serious challenges, from combatting cybercrime to bolstering public safety. Rolling up his sleeves in this way comes naturally to him. In fact, the Lugar Center and Georgetown University recently recognized him as one of the most bipartisan members of Congress. Earlier this year John announced that he will not seek another term in office. However, he has made it clear that he considers the opportunity to work on behalf of the community he calls home the professional honor of a lifetime.

A Camillus, N.Y., native, John graduated with honors from both Niagara University and Syracuse University College of Law. He began his legal career in private practice at a firm in Washington, D.C. However, it was not long before John felt tugged to public service, working first as a senior trial attorney at the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission before commencing a 20-year career as an assistant U.S. attorney for the U.S. Department of Justice. Early in his time as a federal prosecutor, John served as a special assistant U.S. attorney in the Eastern District of Virginia and with the DOJ's Criminal Division, Narcotics and Dangerous Drug Section. In this capacity, John served as a senior trial attorney on the U.S.-Mexico border in El Paso, Texas, and in San Juan, Puerto Rico. During his time as a federal organized crime prosecutor in Syracuse for the U.S. Attorney's Office in the Northern District of New York, he successfully prosecuted the first-ever Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act (RICO) gang case in the City of Syracuse, which led to a significant drop in the city's violent crime rate.

John has been honored with the top prosecutor award by three separate attorneys general, both Democrat and Republican, for his work on the Gang Violence Task Force and international drug-trafficking investigations. He has lectured at Syracuse University College of Law and Cornell Law School, and led attorney trainings for criminal investigations and prosecutions worldwide in Moscow, Croatia, Trinidad and Tobago, Brazil and El Salvador.

Through it all, he has remained active in the Central New York community. He has served as president of the Central New York Chapter of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and is involved in other community organizations, including the Onondaga County Foster Parent Program and the Camillus Youth Hockey Association.

WILLIAM WHITAKER

When Washington Jesuit Academy (WJA) first opened its doors in 2002, it did so in a borrowed space with four teachers and 20 students whose families put their trust in a new educational model that promised their sons more – more opportunities to grow, to learn and to reflect. The academy was the brainchild of educator William Whitaker. A native of Chevy Chase, Md., Bill sought to provide boys in grades four through eight from underserved, low-income communities with the tools necessary for success, including a well-rounded curriculum, enriching activities, three nutritious meals a day, and emotional support – at no cost. Bill's vision didn't end there. It also included a family resiliency program to keep students' loved ones involved in their educational journey, and a graduate support program to assist alumni with academic and social needs through high school, particularly as they navigated the college application process. Today, 20 years later, the success of this model is clear. Nearly 90 percent of WJA graduates are enrolled in college or trade school or engaged in the workforce. Yet Bill is most proud of his current and former students' capacity to serve as role models, to help others, and to take responsibility for their futures.

Bill would likely be the first person to acknowledge that WJA is rigorous. Students spend 11 hours a day, 11 months a year at the academy, which allows them to form close bonds with their teachers and one another. They take part in unique programs designed to advance their spiritual, intellectual and emotional growth, such as a daily Formation class in which they examine local and global issues and explore the tradition and practice of Ignatian spirituality. From their first year at WJA to their last, students grow as leaders, critical thinkers and citizens. The academy has become a model for combatting poverty and opening doors for underserved students. The graduating class of 2021, for example, earned a 100 percent acceptance and enrollment rate into Catholic, independent and public charter schools. The academy's alumni are extremely loyal, with 85 percent remaining engaged with their alma mater.

Those close to Bill are not surprised that he has chosen to dedicate his life to this important work. He has long been passionate about education. Prior to founding WJA, he worked at Gonzaga College High School, where he served as dean of admissions and financial aid from 1997 to 2001 and as assistant dean of students and director of the work-aid program from 1991 to 1997. Bill earned a bachelor's degree in recreation and physical education management from Arcadia University and a certificate in leadership coaching for organizational performance from American University. An ex-officio member of the board of directors of WJA, Bill is also a member of the boards of the Mater Dei School and Red Cloud Indian School. He has been a member of the Order of the Knights of Malta, the John Carroll Society and the Society of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick. He holds an honorary degree from the University of Scranton.

VOLODYMYR ZELENSKYY

"Ukraine hath always aspired after liberty," Voltaire wrote in his memoir about Swedish King Charles XII. In this work, the French philosopher recounts the Battle of Poltava in 1709, where the Swedish king formed an alliance with Ukrainian Hetman Ivan Mazepa to fight the Russian Empire. The battle ended in a Swedish and Ukrainian defeat. Mazepa was exiled, Ukraine was denied its sovereignty, and the Ukrainians were subjected to Russian rule.

For centuries, Ukraine has fought for its autonomy, territorial integrity and democracy. The recent Russian invasion is just another chapter in Ukraine's long journey toward true independence. Russia's unprovoked war has devasted the country, but Ukraine will persevere as it has finally found its leader: President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

Born in Kryvyi Rih, Ukraine, Zelenskyy would study law and earn a degree from the Kyiv National Economic University. He worked as an actor, performer, writer and producer for two decades before announcing his candidacy for the Ukrainian presidency. On the 2019 presidential campaign trail, then-candidate Zelenskyy ran on an anti-corruption and de-oligarchizing platform. He promoted unity between various ethnic groups in Ukraine, and established himself as an anti-establishment political figure.

Following the 2019 presidential election, where he received 73 percent of the popular vote, President Zelenskyy led Ukraine toward Western integration. He helped implement anti-corruption reforms and requirements so that his country could meet European standards. Ukraine recently made history when it formally requested to join the European Union as a candidate member.

Now, as Russia conducts its illegal and unprovoked invasion of Ukraine, President Zelenskyy has shown the world what his country is willing to sacrifice to achieve true freedom and democracy. Ukraine's resilience against the Russian incursion has reminded the globe that it is worth fighting for these values. He has united the world by promoting democratic thoughts, values and principles, and he is helping turn the hopes and dreams of all Ukrainians into reality. During Russia's ongoing war, President Zelenskyy's leadership has been astounding. When several Western countries offered to safely take him out of Ukraine, President Zelenskyy responded by saying, "I need ammunition, not a ride." He reiterated that he would not leave Ukraine during the war, and that his homeland would win. He has utilized his law background and career in show business to inform the world about the ongoing Russian invasion of Ukraine.

President Zelenskyy's actions have inspired Ukrainians to be brave, and to do great things. Most important, he has united the world. Through his integrity, guidance, resilience and courage, Ukraine will finally earn the liberty it deserves.

He is a demonstrated leader, and he has inspired hearts and minds around the world. A LOOK BACK: 2021-22 Academic Year Highlights



During the 2021-22 academic year, Le Moyne celebrated its 75th anniversary. President Linda LeMura, Ph.D., reflected on what that milestone means to the more than 30,000 Le Moyne alumni around the world during her remarks at the Mass of the Holy Spirit. Dr. LeMura said in part: "I know Le Moyne and I know the power of Jesuit education. I know Le Moyne students. I also know that for 75 years this College, this learning family, has looked to the world and seen opportunity to serve others where others have found only darkness."

Among the prestigious graduate schools recent graduates have been admitted to are American University, Clarkson University, Columbia University, Cornell University, Creighton University, Fordham University, George Mason University, Georgetown University, Gonzaga University, Penn State University, Suffolk University, Syracuse University, University of Maryland and Western New England Law School. In addition, alumni have accepted jobs with a number of highly respected organizations, including Bankers Healthcare Group, BNY Mellon, Crouse Hospital, Elmcrest Children's Center, Equitable, Goldman Sachs Ayco, IBM, Liberty Resources LLC, Maxim Healthcare Services, Syracuse City School District and the U.S. Marshals Service.

Recent graduates are also volunteering their time with the Center for Working Families, Peace Corps, Jesuit Volunteer Corps, Jesuit Alumni Volunteer Program and AmeriCorps.

The board of trustees approved a four-year extension of President LeMura's contract. Dr. LeMura will now lead Le Moyne through June 30, 2026, which will make her the longest-serving president in the College's history. In making this decision, the trustees cited Dr. LeMura's capacity to impact, influence and inspire those around her.

The Princeton Review ranked Le Moyne among the top 15 percent of Colleges in the nation for the ninth consecutive year and included the College in its guide, *The Best 387 Colleges: 2022 Edition.* In addition, for the 30th consecutive year, *U.S. News and World Report* included Le Moyne in its popular guidebook. It ranked the College number five in its "Strong Commitment to Undergraduate Teaching" listing and number five in its "Best Colleges for Veterans" listing. Le Moyne was also nationally ranked for analytics (#20), management information systems (#22), finance (#42) and accounting (#50).

In addition, several graduate programs at Le Moyne were recognized in rankings released by U.S. News & World Report. The MBA Analytics program was ranked #33 nationally, while three programs in the Purcell School of Professional Studies were also ranked: Physician Assistant Studies at #64; Occupational Therapy at #141; and Best Nursing Schools (Master's) at #167.

A total of 97 percent of the members of the Class of 2021 reported employment in a sector related to their field of study or admittance to graduate school within a year of Commencement.

The College announced that it will launch a new program, Doctor of Nursing Practice: Family Nurse Practitioner, in fall 2022 as part of its effort to continue to add degree programs that are essential to supporting the nation's health care system and infrastructure. The DNP curriculum – like that of all of the College's health care programs – reflects Le Moyne's Jesuit philosophy of educating the whole person and is designed to foster professionalism, intellectual capacity, and respect for the dignity of all persons. It will build on the College's current Master in Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program and provide a seamless path to the DNP for currently certified FNPs.

Le Moyne's Manresa Program was honored with the 2021 Ignatian Medal for Outstanding Campus Program by the Jesuit Association of Student Personnel Administrators. Launched in 2015, Manresa is a one-of-a-kind initiative that blends academic experience with career development, personal growth and a desire to change the world.

A total of 38 students representing 14 academic disciplines shared the findings of the original research they conducted during Scholars Day.

For 37 consecutive semesters, 18.5 years, Le Moyne student-athletes have maintained an overall grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

Le Moyne, the City of Syracuse and the Town of DeWitt sought public feedback on their ideas to expand and develop the Salt Springs neighborhood and surrounding area. The Le Moyne Area Neighborhood Development Strategy (LANDS) draft plan is set to guide the development of transformational projects on and around the College's campus in the months and years ahead. LANDS encompasses a variety of topics, including transportation, housing, infrastructure, municipal services, economic development and overall quality of life in the area.

President LeMura was named co-president of the New York Regional Economic Development Council, a key component of New York state's transformative approach to state investment and economic development.

The College received two grants from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation totaling \$475,000. Both are renewals of grants for initiatives that the Foundation had previously funded and will support two distinct areas of the health care community in Central New York during the 2022 calendar year. The grants will support Cabrini Scholarships in Nursing and the Center for Aging Resources and Enrichment's "Spirituality Connection in Aging: A Post-Pandemic Webinar Series."

Le Moyne's Collegiate Science and Technology Entry Program (CSTEP), a successful support system for underrepresented students, saw an upswing in its recruitment, welcoming 16 new first-year students in the fall of 2021. A total of 80 students are on the CSTEP roster, surpassing the goal of 68 students. In the fall 2021 semester, the average GPA for students in the program was 3.2, with half of the students currently on the Dean's List.

The College launched the Poland Center for Research and Teaching Innovation to build the intellectual infrastructure and faculty capacity, skills and knowledge needed to strengthen the research culture within the Madden School of Business. Named for Le Moyne alumnus Walter Poland '66, the Center focuses on innovation and thought leadership with an eye toward deepening global engagement and societal impact.

As many school districts in Central New York and across the state work to address an impending teacher shortage, Le Moyne announced that it will offer a temporary tuition decrease of approximately 35 percent for students in the College's Master of Science in Education and Master of Science in Teaching programs.

Le Moyne created two endowed professorships in the College of Arts and Sciences. The new professorships – the 75th Anniversary Endowed Professor of Humanities and the Endowed Professorship for the Study of the Americas – are intended to increase diversity throughout all aspects of the Academic Affairs Division, including research, teaching and service.

The College was again recognized by The Princeton Review as one of the nation's most environmentally responsible higher educational institutions, and was included in the organization's 2022 *Guide to Green Colleges*. The Princeton Review editors analyzed more than 25 data points to determine a Green Rating score for the schools on a scale of 60 to 99. Le Moyne received a green rating of 85.
