



Le Moyne College Summer Arts Institute COVID-19 Safety Protocols

Screening

- Participants and program staff will complete a mandatory health screening each morning before being allowed to participate.
- Parents/guardians will keep sick participants or participants experiencing COVID-19-like symptoms home
- Parents/guardians will inform program staff immediately of an absence due to possible exposure to COVID-19
- If a participant or their household member becomes symptomatic for COVID-19 and/or tests positive, the child must quarantine and may not return or attend the remainder of the program
- The state and local health department will be notified about any positive test result by a staff or participant on site.
- If a camper or staff member is feeling ill or needs to leave during a camp day due to COVID-like symptoms, the individual will need a negative COVID test before returning to camp.

Daily Safety Protocol

- Staff and campers must perform hand hygiene immediately upon entering the program through hand washing or the use of hand sanitizer.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in all program spaces.
- Participants and staff will wear face coverings, covering mouth and nose, at all times while indoors. Students will be given mask breaks throughout the program day, but these breaks will be taken outdoors and while students are at least 6 feet from one another.
- Participants must provide their own masks. (The program will have disposable masks available onsite in the case that a participant forgets theirs.)
- Program participants and staff will maintain a social distance of at least 6 feet.
- To the extent possible, participants will remain in static small groups that do not use common spaces at the same time.
- Hard surfaces (e.g., door knobs, music stands, hard chairs) will be disinfected on a regular basis.
- Participants will not share food or writing implements.
- Weather permitting, check-in and check-out each day will take place outdoors.

- Programs will not include final live performances for family and friends as in past years. Where possible, student performances/work will be filmed and shared with family online.
- Lunch will take place outdoors, weather permitting, continuing to maintain distancing of 6 feet.

In the Event of a Potential Exposure

- Parents/legal guardians will be immediately informed about any potential contact their children may have had with suspected or confirmed cases
- Parents/legal guardians will be immediately informed if their child(ren) are experiencing any symptoms.
- If a participant tests positive, the other members of that participant's group will switch to a virtual platform for the remainder of the program if the health department deems it necessary.
