DURATION OF STUDY

Students can study abroad at IQS for the Spring semester only which runs from January to June.

ORIENTATION

Exchange students are required to attend both a welcome meeting and one-to-one orientation with the International Relations Office before classes begin.

GRADING SYSTEM

IQS's grading scale goes from 0 to 10:

5 to 6.9	Satisfactory

IQS will send your academic transcript to Le Moyne at the end of the semester.

Study Abroad Applications

- Attend a Study Abroad Information Session one year before you intend to study abroad. Then, complete the **Request for Study Abroad Approval form** for at least two options. Return completed forms to the Office of Inclusive Excellence and Global Education in RH 344.
- If approved, you will need to submit an application form and supporting documents to IQS, including a copy of the photo-ID page in your passport, a digital passport-style photo, proof of health insurance coverage, an academic transcript, and a personal statement.

COURSE SELECTION: Students are required to complete a **Course Approval form** before registering for courses at their study abroad institution. **Failure to complete this form may result in loss of credit.**

Students should select a minimum of **6-8 courses** and have these approved by their department chair (and/or the director of the Core program).

Courses at IQS are generally worth between 3-9 ECTS. To maintain full-time status, you should enroll in 24-30 ECTS (equivalent to 12-15 U.S. credits).



Visa Information

Students studying in Spain for a period longer than 90 days are required to obtain a Student Visa. In order to apply for the visa, you will need to pay a **\$160 fee** and submit the following documents to your nearest Spanish Consulate or Embassy:

- Visa application form
- Passport-size photograph
- Valid passport
- Letter of acceptance from IQS
- Proof of health insurance
- Proof of finances. You will need to document that you have access to at least **\$700 for every month** you will be in Spain.

Health Insurance

All exchange students are required to provide proof of health insurance for the duration of their stay in Spain. The policy must cover all medical costs, including accidents, emergencies, and repatriation.

Accommodation

IQS does not have its own accommodation for students, but will assist you in finding somewhere to live. A list of housing options in Barcelona is available [here](#). You can choose to live in a residence, apartment, or with a family.

Cost of Living

IQS recommends that students budget between **€750-1300 (~\$840-1460) per month** to cover accommodation, meals, public transport use, books, and other miscellaneous costs.

Student Support

SPANISH COURSE: An intensive Spanish course worth 5 ECTS is offered prior to the start of the semester.

MENTOR PROGRAM: The International Relations Office assigns a mentor to exchange and international students. A mentor is an IQS student who will support you as you learn to navigate IQS and Barcelona.
