

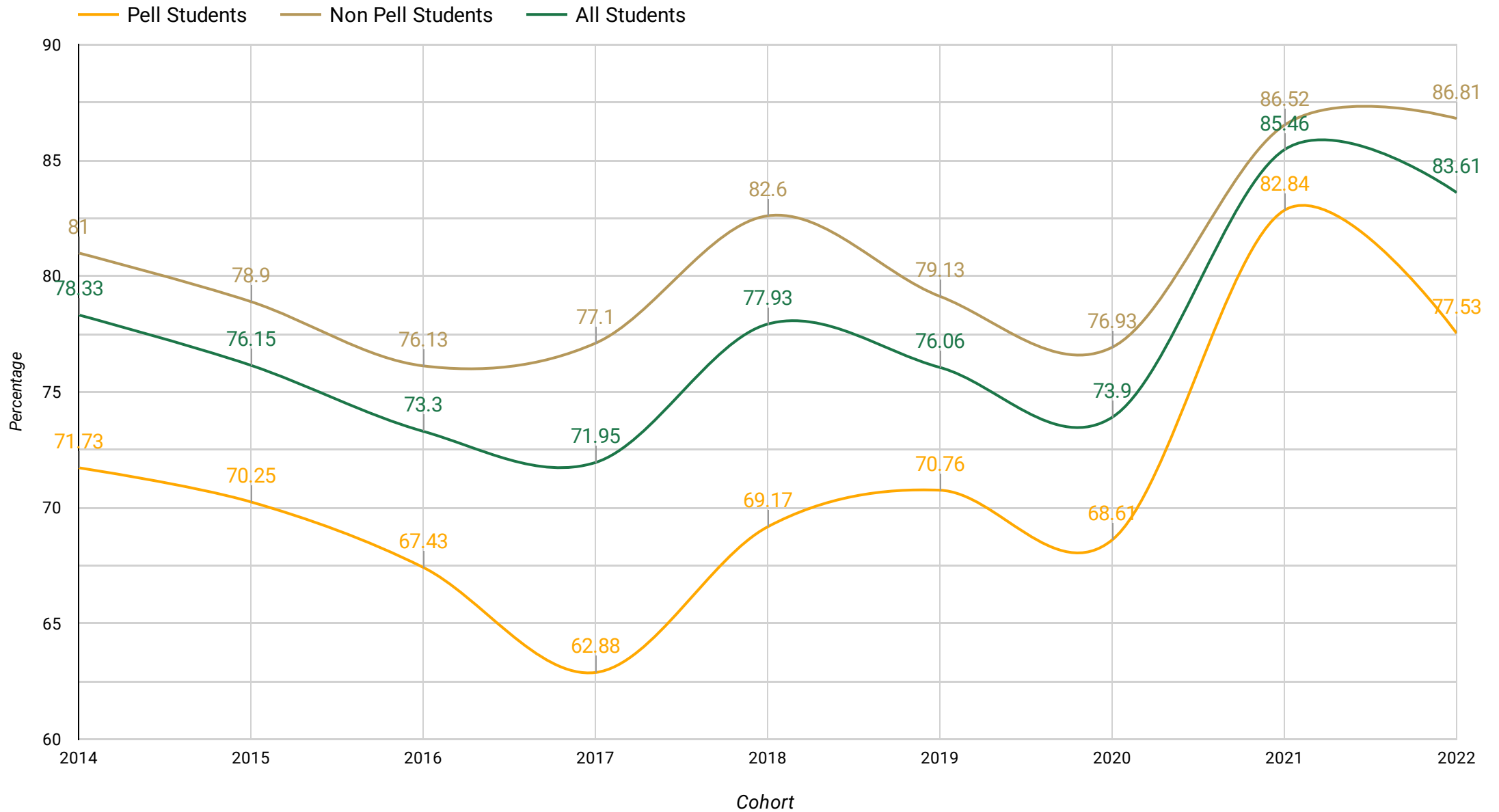

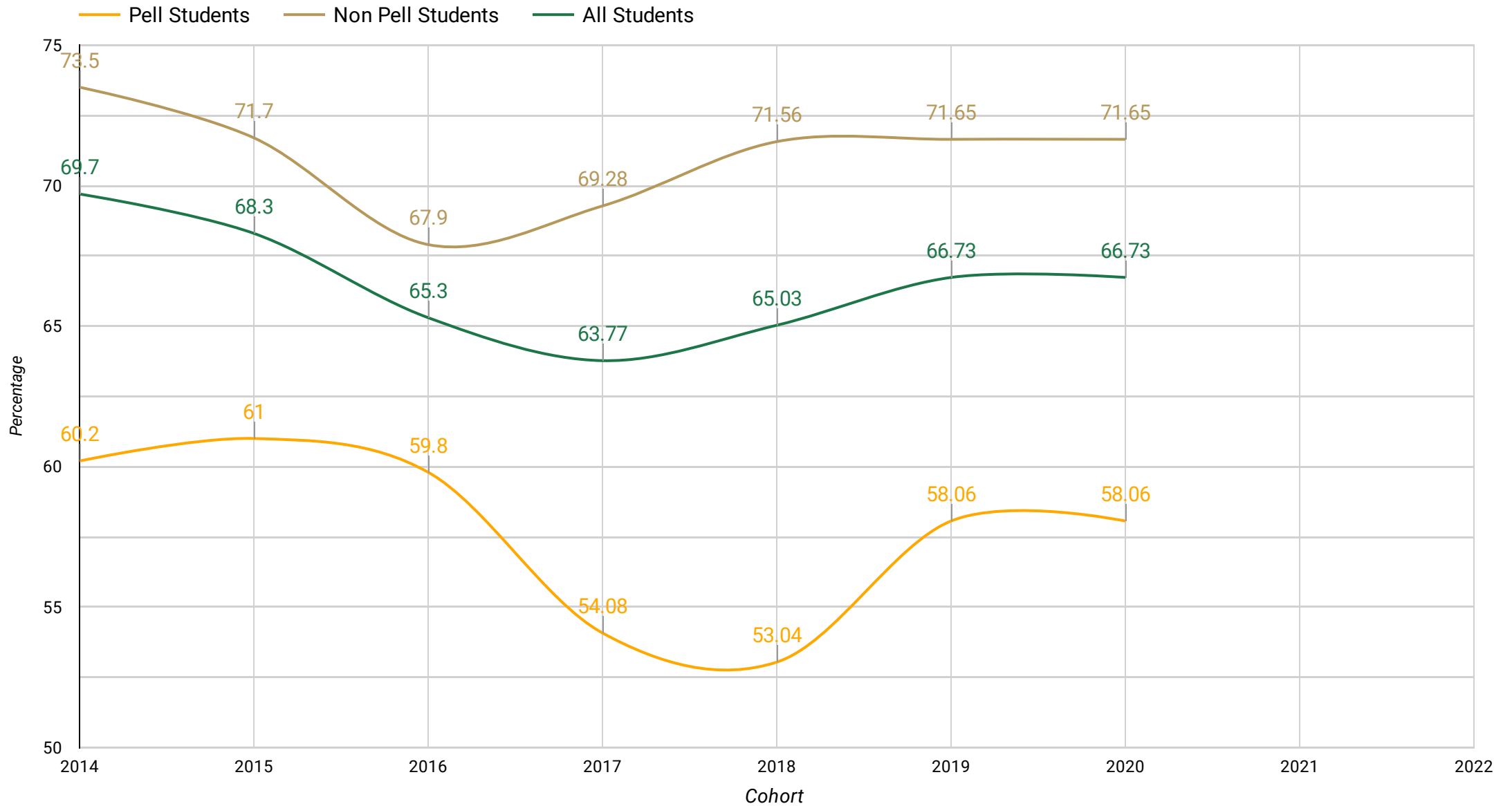
1. Retention rate is defined as the percentage of first-time, full time bachelor's degree-seeking undergraduate students from the previous fall who are again enrolled in the current fall. Graduation rate is defined as the percentage of first-time, full time bachelor's degree-seeking undergraduate students who completed their program within 4 years, within 5 years, or within 6 years.

2. Retention rates and graduation rates are broken into three categories: students who received a Federal Pell Grant, students who did not receive a Federal Pell Grant, and all students regardless of financial aid.

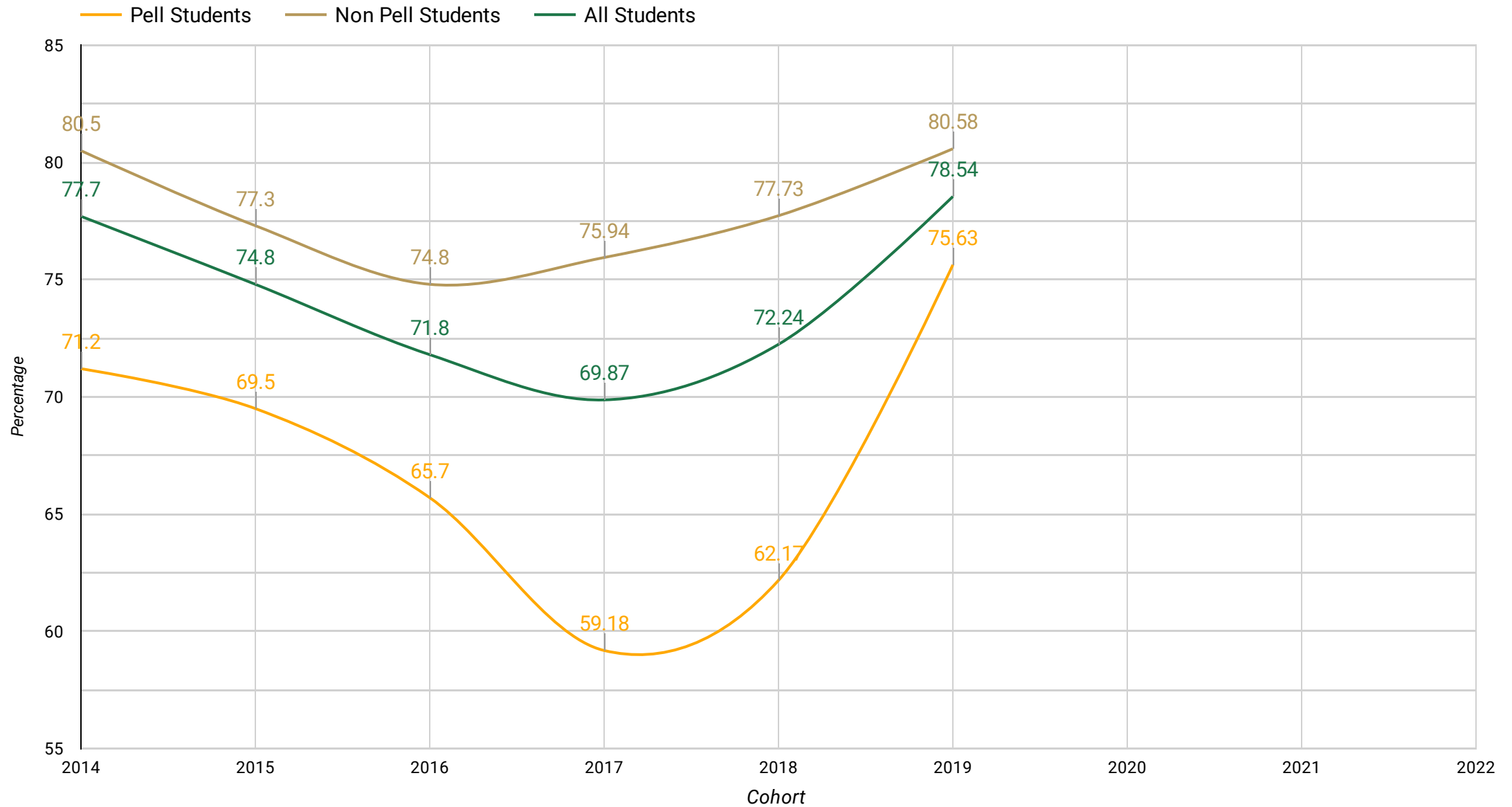
# Retention By Pell Status
